CENTRAL AUSTRALIAN MASTERS GAMES

THE ISSUES

- That a sports festival, to be known as the Central Australian Masters Games, for mature age athletes be conducted in Alice Springs during October 1986, and possibly thereafter on a bi-annual basis.
- That the Northern Territory Government agree to under-write the operational costs associated with the staging of the Games, currently estimated at \$200,000.

BACKGROUND

3. A preliminary feasibility study has been undertaken by the Confederation of Australian Sport (CAS) on behalf of the Northern Territory Tourist Commission (NTTC), to determine the economic and logistical viability of the Northern Territory hosting a Masters Games. Details of the CAS proposal and conditions relative to the conduct of the Games are provided at Attachment A. A number of amendments are proposed, notably that CAS should not be the controlling body.

- Alice Springs was identified as a suitable venue because of climate and economic advantages.
- The Department of Youth, Sport, Recreation and Ethnic Affairs has had preliminary discussions with National, Northern Territory and Alice Springs Sporting organisations.
- This will be the first Masters Games of its kind to be held in Australia.

CONSIDERATION OF THE ISSUES

- 7. New visitor markets and attractions are required to support the substantial increase in accommodation capacity developed throughout the Northern Territory in recent years. The NTTC has identified sport as providing the potential for a substantial impetus to visitor growth patterns.
- 8. The staging of the Games in October 1986 will serve to attract additional visitation to the Territory during a 'shoulder period' of the tourist year. The southern section of the Stuart Highway, should be largely completed by October 1986.

- 9. The Games are expected to embrace approximately twelve different sports and involve approximately 2,000 competitors, including 300 locals. The following sports have indicated willingness to participate: Lawn Bowls; Tennis; Ten Pin Bowling; Shooting; Netball; Table Tennis; Indoor Cricket; Badminton; and Volley Ball. Baseball; Swimming; Basketball; Athletics; Hockey & Rugby Union are also likely to take part.
- Tasmania have recently indicated an interest in staging a Masters Games in October 1986.

OPTIONS

- 10. The options for consideration are:
 - (a) To reject the CAS invitation
 - (b) To accept the CAS invitation in principle for the Territory to host the Central Australian Games in Alice Springs during October 1986, and to devote the necessary resources for that purpose.

(c) To adopt the concept, but with the NT
Government being convenor and principle
organising authority in conjunction with
CAS. This is the preferred option.

PUBLIC IMPACT

11. Generally favourable public and tourist industry reaction can be anticipated. However, as it is possible that the festival will be conducted on a bi-annual basis in Central Australia due to more favourable economic considerations, criticism of this aspect may be forthcoming from industry operatives located in other major Territory centres, notably Darwin. This could be offset by the proposed North Australia Games which would be held in Darwin, in alternate years. It is expected that the North Australia Games will be a bigger event including Asian country's involvement.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

12. CAS has estimated the direct economic impact of the Games as approximately \$1.4m. Operational

costs, for which the Territory would be required to under-write, have been estimated by the Department at \$300,000 (Attachment B). However, it can be reasonably expected that these costs will be largely off-set by corporate sponsorship, marketing and licencing rights, direct sales of approved products and registration fees. Funds may also be sought from the Sports Commission of the Federal Department of Sport, Recreation and Tourism.

 Under this scenario, preliminary estimates of costs, for which the Territory would be required to guarantee, is \$200,000.

EMPLOYMENT AND STAFFING

14. The CAS Report advocates the appointment of a professional sports administrator on a full-time basis with responsibility for the overall administration of the Games organisation and conduct. This notion is supported. However, it is suggested that suitable candidates, other than those available from CAS, may possess greater suitability for the position and that the Games would be more appropriately organised by the Northern Territory Government in conjunction with CAS.

- 15. The positions should be contracted to the Department of Youth, Sport, Recreation and Ethnic Affairs at the Executive E2 Level and Administrative Class A6 Level. These positions would also cover the proposed North Australia Games, the subject of another Cabinet Submission to be considered in the near future. Further Secretariat support could be provided from existing Departmental resources.
- 16. In addition, a small 5-7 person organising committee would also be required with nominees drawn from appropriate Territory Government Departments/Authorities, sporting groups, and including suitable persons from private enterprise.

COMMONWEALTH, STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENT RELATIONS

17. The Commonwealth Government, through the Department of Sport, Recreation and Tourism, could be expected to support the proposal. The Alice Springs Town Council is fully supportive.

CO-ORDINATION AND CONSULTATION

- 18. This submission has been prepared in consultation with the Department of Law, Treasury, The Public Service Commissioner and the Northern Territory Tourist Commission.
- 19. All Departments consulted, were in support of the proposal except the Department of Treasury, who suggested that the financial implications had not been thoroughly researched. It is acknowledged there is an element of risk, however without Cabinet endorsement investigation cannot proceed further.

PUBLICITY

20. A decision is required as soon as possible in order to take full advantage of available publicity opportunities and to provide sufficient lead-time for the organisation mechanisms and facilities to be set in place, if the proposal is to be implemented.

The objectives of a Masters Sports Festival are to:

- provide an effective incentive for mature age athletes to renew or maintain their active participation in a sporting discipline
- provide a focus for national sporting associations to identify mature age athletes, establish communication with their groups and to encourage their involvement in the mainstream of Australian sport
- establish a communication link with mature age athletes in order to determine their needs, to keep them appraised of activities of interest to them and to maximise participation in all sporting activities for them
- to stimulate and promote community interest and participation in sport.

HIST !

The Confederation of Australian Sport proposes to establish the concept of sports festivals for mature age athletes in Australia.

m AS}$ the Australian Secretariat for the International Board of Governors for Masters Games the Confederation is keen to encourage Australian cities to host such festivals.

At its 1984 Annual General Meeting, the Confederation was directed by its Member Associations to pursue the objective of a National Masters Sports Festival.

It is therefore committed to encourage and promote sporting competitions for mature age athletes through a national sports festival open to participants in as many sports as possible within the limits of economic and logistical viability. GENE RULES

Name

The festival will be known as the Cenral Australia Masters Games or such name as is mutually agreed by the Northern Territory Government and the Confederation of Australian Sport.

Relationship to other events

Central Australia Masters Games will be an independent sports festival. They will not include the national veterans championships of any sport unless they are open to any competitors and be approved by the Confederation of Australian Sport.

Eligibility

Athletes may participate in as many sports as they wish. The Games shall be open to all competitors who qualify for each sport entered under the eligibility provisions of the international governing body for the relevant sports. It is expected that the total competitors will not exceed 1500, and the total will approximate 1800 including 300 locals.

Each participating national sports association shall appoint a Sport Coordinator responsible for liaison with the Organising Committee and Games Manager for the organisation of its sports programme within thirty days of being accepted as a participating sport.

gach participant will be required to pay a registration fee to the (anising Committe at least 60 days before the first day of competitions. The relevant national sporting association will receive the entry fee component of the fee but no entrant will represent any club, association or other group.

The entry fee component will be \$15.00

Each participating national sporting association will be required to submit details in respect to the numbers of officials to the Organising Committee 180 days before the first day of the Games. They will also be required to submit a listing of all competitors, officials and VIP guests at least 30 days before the first day of the Games.

Medals

Gold, silver and bronze medals especially made for the Central
Australia Masters Games will be awarded to individual competitors and/or
each member of a team having competed in an activity and achieved
a placing as follows:-

First place - Gold Second place - Silver Third place - Bronze The Organising Committee will present each competitor and official participating in the Central Australia Masters Games with an appropriate memento of the Games.

Flag

Only the official Australian Masters Games flag as approved by the Confederation of Australian Sport is to be used to represent the Games or the Organising Committee.

Official functions will be hosted at each Games by:-

Opening Ceremony - Organising Committee

Organising Committee

The costs associated with each function are to be borne by the Organising Committee.

On bunalf of its Member Associations, the Confederation of Australian Sport extends an invitation to the Northern Territory Government to host the Central Australia Masters Games.

If wishing to respond affirmatively to the invitation, the Government will need to indicate agreement to the following conditions:-

- The Government guarantees that the Games will be conducted in accordance with the policies, rules and regulations of the Masters Games Board of Governors, the relevant International Sports Federations and of the Confederation of Australian Sport.
- A legal entity form acceptable to the Confederation of Australian Sport will be given to the Organising Committee.
- 3. The Government will financially provide for a Games Manager, a Games Secretariat and suitable office accommodation.
- 4. The Government will contribute financially to the income of the Games and underwrite them on behalf of the Organising Committee.
- 5. The Government will assist in negotiations with other Governments individuals or organisations from the private sector to ensure the successful conduct of the Games in terms of competitor satisfaction and financial viability.
- 6. Comprehensive transportation facilities are available and the support of local transport authorities will be forthcoming.
- The Government will assist the Organising Committee to ensure adequate accommodation facilities for participants, officials and accompanying persons are available.

The Central Australia Masters Games will be open to all masters athletes. Often referred to as veterans or seniors. The masters are mature sportsmen and women competing in age related groups. Most become masters at 35 for women and 40 for men although somesports have divisions that start at earlier ages but almost all are classified in five year ranges.

Masters may be amateurs or professionals. Some may have been international champions, others will become champions among masters. Some are latecomers to their sport; others play solely for the pleasure of beating their age.

Participants in the Central Australia Masters Games will be there to meet others, compete, have fun and to enjoy the contacts, companionship and excitement of a festival of sport.

They will enjoy the variey of events and functions that surround a national sports festival and will compete as individuals and wear the colours and uniforms of their sport.

The Sports

A range of sports will be selected by the Confederation of Australian Sport in consultation with the Organising Committee.

The number and type of sports will depend upon the availability of facilities, the total accommodation capacity of Alice Springs, the financial viability and the enthusiasm and capability of the sporting organisations. It is expected that the festival will embrace approximately eight sports.

As a guide, the following sports are nominated for consideration:
Lawn Bowls, Tennis, Ten Pin Bowling, Shooting, Netball, Table Tennis,
Touch, Cricket, Badminton, Orienteering, Volleyball, Archery,
Billiards and Snooker, Darts.

Organisational Structure

It is suggested that a company limited by guarantee be formed by the host state to act as the Organising Committee.

The company would accept the invitation of the Board of Directors of the Confederation of Australian Sport to conduct the Games.

A Federal Directorate will be established which will provide the administrative link between the Confederation and the Organising Committee. The expenses of the Directorate are to be met by the Organising Committee.

The Organising Committee will appoint a Games Manager to oversee all Operational aspects of the Games and to coordinate the activites of the Various sub-committees.

The Federal Directorate will be ex officio to the Organising Committee and attend meetings on matters of finance and sponsorship but will

not be involved on a day to day basis with the Organising Committee although providing consultation as required.

In respect to conduct of the Central Australia Masters Games, the Northern Territory Government through the Organising Committee will need to abide by the policies and rules nominated by the Confederation of Australian Sport and by the rules and regulations applicable to each participating sport in respect to competitions and competitors.

The Confederation of Australian Sport will also need to be satisfied with the legal entity form given to the Organising Committee.

The Central Australia Masters Games will be funded by income from the following sources :-

- Northern Territory Government
- Commonwealth Government (if requested by the Northern Territory Government)
- _ Sponsorship
- _ Marketing of the approved logos and trade marks
- Interest on invested funds
- Sales of publications and licensed products
- Rental of signage sites

and any other sources deemed appropriate by the Organising Committee.

As part of their obligations the Northern Territory Government and the Organising Committee will develop a financial budget which will cover all income and expenses relating to the festival. The budget which is subject to approval by the Confederation of Australian Sport will aim to:-

- 1. ensure that the festival is conducted on a profitable basis
- 2. seek to ensure that the participating national associations have their venue costs met plus receive the entry fee portion of each registration pertinent to their sport
- provide the Confederation of Australian Sport with a contribution towards the post-Games servicing and development of masters athletes.

- Arrangements of all officials and technical delegates necessary for the conduct of the competition
- Determination, in association with the Organising Committee of all awards to be presented to competitors.

Note: National sports associations selected for participation in the Central Australia Masters Games must guarantee to observe strict guidelines nominated by the Confederation of Australian Sport and the Organising Committee on such matters as submission of financial estimates, reports, observance of requirements in regard to television coverage, sponsorship and licensing, sale of approved items, the outfitting of competitors and officials and provision of access to all materials and documents for the confirmation of expenditures and the like.

In summary, participating sports associations will be autonomous in respect to the technical conduct of competitions but in all other respects must observe the policies of the Confederation of Australian Sport and the Organising Committee.
